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


Dear Tri County Family,

Each spring we are faced with the task of closing out one school year while preparing for the next school year. In order to meet our goals, we have to look for improvements in all departments, in our curriculum, and review our processes and procedures. As with many districts, the ultimate challenge is how to do this with less financial support. Tri County is fortunate to have a Board of Education that is fiscally responsible. In 2009, the district was at it's peak for per pupil funding, and was able to have a fund balance (or savings) of over 20%. Since the decline in per pupil funding over the years the district has needed to use a portion of this fund balance to maintain quality programing.

The following graphs show our per pupil funding trend (which includes a trend line if we stayed consistent with the consumer price index), and a graph of the use of fund equity to maintain programs.



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Every Child, Every School, Vote

Montcalm Area Intermediate School District is asking voters to support a special education millage on May 6th. Voters last approved an increase in special education funding 24 years ago. Since then, the needs of our students and the cost to support those needs have risen dramatically. Many special education programs and services are mandated by state and federal law and cannot be reduced or eliminated.

If the millage is approved, it will help to maintain current programming, as well as restore funding to each local district's general budget. If this millage is not approved, districts will be forced to utilize more dollars designated for general education to support special education costs. Since special education programs and services are mandated under state and federal law and cannot be eliminated, this will result in general education programs and/or services being reduced or eliminated. Additionally, the ISD may be forced to bill local districts for mandated services they are currently providing, resulting in additional costs to our district.

Voter registration deadline is April 7, 2014. You can register at your local township clerk's office or at any Secretary of State office. You must be registered by April 7th in order to vote on May 6. You can also use an absentee ballot to vote on the Special Education Millage. The deadline to apply for an absentee ballot is May 3. Ballot applications are available by visiting your local township clerk, or visit www.Michigan.gov/sos for information and applications for registering to vote or applying for an absentee ballot.

Providing Supports to Students with Print Disabilities

Staff at Tri County Middle School have committed themselves to providing special education students with print disabilities the tools they need to be successful in the general education curriculum. Special education teachers, with assistance from TC's technology team, are working to provide access to Bookshare, an online library for students with print



disabilities (i.e. learning disability in reading). This online library provides students access to copyrighted content for free. This includes textbooks used by the district, as well as books that can be read for pleasure. Students with print disabilities are able to download books for free onto their computers, tablets, phones, MP3 players and IPods. Students are then able to listen to text. Bookshare reads the text, highlights words as they are being read, assists with identifying meaning of unknown words, and allows students to take notes. We have observed students who once struggled with reading, now struggling to put their books down!
