BOND UPDATE

It's been a busy fall on the construction site of the new Tri County Elementary school. Finish work has begun, with carpet going down, trim work being done, and cabinets installed. The basketball hoops have also been installed in the gym, and kitchen equipment is beginning to be installed. The walk-in freezers are huge!



At the High School, the new Cafetorium is now all enclosed and floors are poured, brick work on the outside is complete, and interior framing has begin. It's an impressive sight as you drive into the high school campus.

The Wastewater project is also progressing as well. The sanitary line is now complete to Howard City and tested, and work has begin on the lift station.



As we step into 2023, it will be another exciting new year! Bids for the Middle School Renovation project have been received and will be awarded at our regular December Board of Education meeting. The key work for the Middle School includes air conditioning in classrooms, updated Science classrooms, new bleachers in the gym, and other classroom upgrades (like paint, carpeting, etc.). Construction will begin as soon as school is out for summer in 2023. We can't wait to see the results of this work when school begins next fall! TCHS School Store Expands

In the Fall of 2019, Tri County High School introduced a Marketing class and a new school store into its class schedule. Soon after opening, the school store quickly grew with many options, both sweet and savory, and became an after school favorite place for students and athletes. The store has become so popular that both students and staff were looking for a larger space for the store. After the helpful cooperation of the Special Education staff, the Marketing class was able to make plans to move to room 114.

Seniors in the Marketing class, under the direction of Mrs. Dollberg, cleaned, painted and organized room 114, transforming it into a fun and useful space for the school store. Once the paint was dry, the entire class worked together to set up both old and new areas in the store, and on October 18, 2022 a new larger and more efficient school store opened. The new space offers students many options for their after-school appetites as well as tumblers, stickers, Chapstick, keychains, and student created tees.

The school store is operated by Marketing students who stock, inventory and sell items after school and during lunch on Fridays. On Fridays, the class also offers orders to the entire school during first hour. Monies raised by the school store are invested in our student incentive programs and other student perks like free Homecoming tees for the student body, donuts or other treats. The Marketing class also sponsors game themes for home sporting events, and this past October offered pink out tees in the school store as well.

TCHS & TCMS Partnering With Paper to Provide Support

Tri County High School and Middle School are partnering with a program called Paper to provide 24/7 academic support for students in grades 6-12. Paper is an online platform that provides students with unlimited 24/7 one-on-one tutoring for all subjects, delivered by a live educator through Paper's Classroom in both English and Spanish. Students can connect with a live tutor in as little as 15-30 seconds, and can access 200 academic topics tutored by Paper specialists.

Each online educator is a Paper employee, who is trained in the Socratic teaching method and undergoes a criminal background check prior to employment.

All student activity on Paper is recorded, tracked, and made readily available to school teachers and administrators. This equips teachers with transparent insights on how their students are learning outside the classroom and helps educators personalize their instruction.

We are excited to be able to offer this great tool for our Middle and High School students, as an extra layer of academic support. Keep an eye out for more communication on when this new tool will be available.

Middle School Art Classes Celebrate Inktober!



During the month of October, the Middle School Art Classes studied the artist, Jake Parker, who created Inktober in 2009 as a challenge to improve his inking skills and develop positive drawing habits. This challenge has since grown into a worldwide endeavor, with thousands of artists taking on the challenge every year. Tri County Middle School started their first Inktober Challenge this year.




Middle School STEM Class Receives Grant

Christina Adamson, Middle School STEM/Computer teacher, was recently awarded a financial grant of \$1,000 from The Awesome Foundation of Ann Arbor, MI, to be used to purchase a STEM (Science Technology Engineering Mathematics) learning tool called the BrainPad Pulse.



The BrainPad Pulse is an LCD input/output STEM microcomputer that students can use to code with block and JavaScript coding for robots, games, and circuits. The BrainPad was developed in Madison Heights, MI, which is one of the reasons Mrs. Adamson chose this device for this grant. She believes it's important that students see that some of the things they are working with are being developed by people that live in the same state as they do. They also discuss teen developers and their creations, such as Vishnu Maro from Grand Rapids City High School, who developed an app called "Spotter", which helps find open parking in downtown Grand Rapids. He too learned how to code using the Code.org platform that we use with students, and applied what he had learned to a problem in his community.








