Message from the Superintendent . . .

It seems you can almost hear the buzz in the air surrounding the 2023-2024 school year. We have not had this much excitement here at Tri County Area Schools since the inception of our district in the fall of 1962 or the opening of our high school in 1992. The opening of the new Tri County Elementary school, and the move toward the central campus, will establish a new chapter in the great legacy of Tri County Area Schools. We are excited you are a part of this legacy.

We are so eager to see our K-5 students enter the new elementary. Each classroom will have improved technology, new furniture, and lockers in the classroom. The building is also equipped with a full library and a Specials wing with dedicated classes for STEM, Art, Music and Gym. Over the summer our teachers have also been preparing for a new and updated K-5 Math curriculum and a new Reading curriculum. We are thrilled that as students step into this state-of-the-art education facility that we can also provide updated curriculums that will improve educational outcomes.

While the elementary is the focal point of the new central campus, we are excited about the addition of the Cafetorium at the High School, which is a fully acoustical auditorium that will be used for concerts and musicals. The Middle School is undergoing a major interior overall. We are painting classrooms, installing new carpet, new student furniture, and the gym floor has been sanded down to its original color and will be updated with new paint, and new bleachers will be installed.

All this work is being completed to better support Educating, Encouraging and Empowering our students. It is our community who has made this vision come to life, and the students are Encouraged by your commitment to them. Many students from every level have shared their appreciation and excitement that they are getting what they see other schools have. As a community we are Empowering our students and we are fueled with excitement for the outcomes this school year and future years will have.

Tri County Childcare

Tri County Child Care programs are now taking enrollments for before and/or after school care. Child Care is offered at Tri County Elementary and Tri County Middle School.

Monday through Friday

6:00 am until school starts /After school to 6:00 pm


AM - \$9 per session, \$3/add. Child

PM - \$9 per session, \$3/add. Child

AM/PM same day - \$16 per day

AM/PM same day - \$13 total cost for each additional child






When school has a delayed start before 6:00 a.m., TC Child Care will be open starting at 7:30 am to receive students. If delayed after 6:00 a.m. childcare will remain open until the start of school. This option is available even if you do not use TC Child Care on the regular basis. Parents wishing to use this service must have all required paperwork completed and on file prior to using this service. Cost for the School Delay Program is \$14.00 for one child, \$5.00 for each additional.

Scheduled Early Release Program

TC Child Care will be running Early Release Day childcare for school aged children (5-12) at Tri County Elementary and Tri County Middle School during the school year, for each of the scheduled early release days. Parents will be required to register separately to attend this program. The cost for the program is \$25.00 for the 1st child, and \$21.00 per child for each additional child. A non-refundable deposit of \$10.00 will be required per child/per date. This \$10.00 fee will be added to the child care account upon requesting care. Free School Meals Continue at TC!

We are pleased to share that Tri County Area Schools is participating in the National School Lunch and Breakfast programs for the 2023-2024 school year. ALL TRI COUNTY AREA SCHOOL students enrolled can receive a healthy breakfast and lunch everyday FREE OF CHARGE. This is a tremendous benefit for our Viking families.

EMERGENCY CLOSING INFORMATION

In clement weather, hazardous road conditions, power outages or other incidents may require the closing of school. However, there are strict state requirements on the number of hours of education for public school students. The state provides up to 30 hours for inclement weather/emergency closing. We are required to make up any additional hours. With student safety as our first priority, every effort is made to avoid school closings when possible. In bad weather, the decision to close school is made after:

- Road conditions are tested by the District Transportation Department,
- Weather conditions are examined (weather advisories, storm patterns, temperature, etc.),
- Montcalm County Road Commission's ability to plow area roads is determined, and
- The condition of school driveways and parking lots are assessed.

The Superintendent closes school based on the severity of these items coupled with our ability to transport our students safely.

When the District closes school or releases students early, we send out a robocall and email to all parents, notify the local TV news stations, and post closing information to our district social media outlets and our district website homepage. Please do not call your child's school.

Inclement Weather Guidelines

There are several principles that guide our decision-making with regard to school closings. First and foremost, is the safety of our students and staff.

On days when inclement weather occurs, we try our best to make the call by 5:00 a.m. to provide as much time as possible for families to be notified so that arrangements may be made for childcare, etc. Once the decision is made to cancel school we inform parents via our robocall system, email, local TV stations, our website and Facebook/Instagram pages. Decisions regarding school closings due to snow and ice are made after TCAS transportation staff make a recommendation regarding the ability of our buses and drivers to safely conduct their routes. It is possible that main roads will be drivable while our many miles of unpaved roads are not. We will close school if the air temperature with wind chill is expected to be at or below -20 degrees Fahrenheit while students are waiting for the bus or walking to school. As always, we encourage our students to dress in layers to protect themselves from the cold.

Annual Legal Notices

Notice for Directory Information Disclosure

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), a Federal law, requires that **Tri County Area Schools (the "District")**, with certain exceptions, obtain your written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from your child's education records. However, Tri County Area Schools may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent, unless you have advised the **District** to the contrary in accordance with District procedures. The primary purpose of directory information is to allow the District to include information from your child's education records in certain school publications. Examples include: A playbill, showing your student's role in a drama production; The annual yearbook; Honor roll or other recognition lists; Graduation programs; and Sports activity sheets, such as for wrestling, showing weight and height of team members.

Directory information, which is information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released, can also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publish yearbooks. In addition, two federal laws require local educational agencies (LEAs) receiving assistance under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended (ESEA) to provide military recruiters, upon request, with the following information – names, addresses and telephone listings – unless parents have advised the LEA that they do not want their student's information disclosed without their prior written consent. [Note: These laws are Section 9528 of the ESEA (20 U.S.C. § 7908) and 10 U.S.C. § 503(c).]

If you do not want Tri County Area Schools to disclose any or all of the types of information designated below as directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must notify the District in writing by September 15, 2023. For a list of information designated by Tri County Area Schools as directory information please visit www.tricountyschools.com.

Asbestos Management Program

This notice is to inform you that state-approved asbestos inspection and management plans exist for all buildings in the school district. These plans are in each building's main office and are available for review.

The management plan contains information regarding the location of all asbestos-containing materials, the condition of the material, and the specific location of any remaining materials.

Detailed re-inspections occur every three years and periodic surveillance is performed every six months. These inspections have confirmed that all known asbestos is properly sealed and has not deteriorated so as to cause a safety concern. Our treatment of remaining asbestos is in conformity with all Environmental Protection Agency guidelines.

Pesticide Control Act

State of Michigan law requires that schools that may apply pesticides on school property must provide an annual advisory to parents or guardians of students attending the facility.

Please be advised that the Tri County Area Schools utilizes all suitable techniques in total pest management with the intent of preventing pests from reaching unacceptable levels or to reduce an existing populations to an acceptable level. Pest management techniques emphasize sanitation, pest exclusion, and biological controls. One of the objectives is to reduce or eliminate the need for pesticides to be utilized.

As required by State of Michigan law, advance notice of the application of a pesticide, other than a bait or gel formulation, will be given 48 hours before the application. Please note that notification is not given for the use of sanitizer, germicides, disinfectants or anti-microbial cleaners. In certain emergencies, such as an infestation of stinging insects, pesticides may be applied without prior notice to prevent injury to students, but parents/guardians will be notified following any such application.

Advance notification of pesticide applications, other than listed above, will be given by using two methods. The first method required by law is the posting at entrances to your child's school. The second method we will use is the posting in a public common area of the school.

Parents are also entitled to received this notice by mail, post-marked 3 days before the application. If you would like to be notified by mail, please contact Thomas Phinney, Operations Director, at 616-636-5454.

Annual Education Reports

The Michigan Department of Education requires all schools to publish an annual report to inform the residents about the status of their schools. This report provides detailed information on student assessment results, Adequate Yearly Progress results, teacher qualification information, and the state results for the National Assessment of Educational Progress.

Right to Request Personal Curriculum

What is a personal curriculum?

The personal curriculum (PC) is a process to modify specific Michigan Merit Curriculum (MMC) high school credit requirements and/or content expectations based on the individual learning needs of a student. It is designed to serve students who want to accelerate or go beyond the MMC requirements and students who need to individualize learning requirements to meet the MMC requirements.

Who may request a personal curriculum?

- The parent or guardian of a student for whom a personal curriculum is sought
- The student, if the student is of the age of majority
- An emancipated minor
- A teacher who is currently teaching the student (who currently teaches in, or whose expertise is in, a subject area proposed to be modified by the PC, or who is determined by the principal to have qualifications otherwise relevant to developing a PC),
- A school counselor or school employee qualified to act in a counseling role.

When may a personal curriculum be requested?

If the student has an Individualized Education Program (IEP), the personal curriculum request may be submitted prior to 9th grade, although any resulting PC may not be implemented until the onset of 9th grade. The earliest submission timeline for all other PC requests is after the student has completed 9th grade. Tri County Upholds CIPA Policy

The Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA) requires schools and libraries to certify that they are enforcing a policy of internet safety that includes measures to block or filter Internet access for both minors and adults to certain visual depictions. References to CIPA are available on our website with the District Technology Plan, under Electronic Information Access and Use Policy, and on the website under Our District/District Policies and Notices.

Nondiscrimination Notice-Title IX and 504

It shall continue to be the policy of the Tri County Area Schools to comply with all federal laws and regulations prohibiting discrimination, and with all requirements and regulations of the U.S. Department of Education. It is the policy (Neola 2260) of the Tri County Area Schools Board of Education does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex (including sexual orientation, or transgender identity), disability, age (except as authorized by law), religion, military status, ancestry, or genetic information (collectively, "Protected Classes") in it's educational programs or activities.

The Board also does not discriminate on the basis of Protected Classes in its employment policies and practices as they relate to students, and does not tolerate harassment of any kind.

Equal educational opportunities shall be available to all students, without regard to the Protected Classes, age (unless age is a factor necessary to the normal operation or the achievement of any legitimate objective of the program/activity), place of residence within the boundaries of the District, or social or economic background, to learn through the curriculum offered in this District. Educational programs shall be designed to meet the varying needs of all students.

Tobacco Use/Products on School Grounds

In order to protect students and employees who choose not to use tobacco from an environment noxious to them and potentially damaging to their health, the Board prohibits the use of tobacco on District premises (owned or leased), in District vehicles, at all school-sponsored events and in all school buildings owned and/or operated by the District.

For the purpose of this policy, "use of tobacco product" means any of the following: the carrying by a person of a lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, or other lighted smoking devices; the inhaling or chewing of a tobacco product; the placing of a tobacco product within a person's mouth; and/or the smoking of electronic, "vapor," or other substitute forms of cigarettes, clove cigarettes or other lighted smoking devices for burning tobacco or any other substance.

Tobacco companies/products may not sponsor any school activity.
